Annual Meeting Summary

The Sunscape Cooperative Annual Meeting took place on February 21, 2024.

Old business covered accepting election results, endorsing the treasurer's report with audit review, and approving the minutes from the 2023 meeting.

The Park Operations update was presented by manager, Larry Jordan. He expressed gratitude to everyone for maintaining their yards. A new maintenance person has joined the team, and Larry thanked everyone for their continued support of management and staff. He extended special thanks to the Activity Director, Anna, as well as, Tana and Ron in the kitchen. Music in the Park was well received, and members are happy with the addition. The picture sessions had a terrific turnout, and the new directory should be released next month. He cautioned everyone that, while the new website is active, it is still undergoing refinements. The final bids for the pool resurfacing are higher than last Spring, as suspected, but the earlier pool issue has been resolved with a larger filter and new pumps. Committee reports were presented and approved, with a note that the election results are effective immediately.

New business included a discussion on potluck dinners which was tabled pending more information. Member comments and discussion led to a few reminders.

- Policing the age of our buyers and visitors is the responsibility of the Welcome Center staff. It is not within the Vision of a Sunscaper to ask people in the park for their age.
- As Sunscapers, all pets must be polite members of the community or be expelled, and they should always be on a 5 ft. leash.

Election Results

The Election Chair, Peggy Gisi, praised co-op members for their strong participation in the election and expressed sincere appreciation for the committee's hard work in conducting an in-person election over multiple days.

With 75% of members voting, Vern Beckstead, Ken MacComber, and Tom Omlid were elected to 3-year terms on the Board of Directors.

- The pool-deck resurfacing measure passed.
- Wood fires are no longer permitted in the park; propane fire pits are still allowed.
- Camper vans, conversion vans, or pickup campers are not allowed in the park for more than three (3) days of loading or unloading.

Other ballot measures failed.

LOOK BACK AT SUNSCAPE HISTORY

2013 - 2014 Season Summary

2014 Shareholder assessment was \$1,350.

Ewwee! What's that smell? Yes, it was an odor emanating from the sewer treatment plant, prompting a 2-year investigation into the sanitary system. Water rates went up roughly \$35 per month due to drought.

The pop machine was removed because of low usage. The Activity Office started selling pop to residents.

In March 2014, the newly-formed Landscape Committee headed by Helen Custer solved the problem of dead grass and "goat heads" west of the Clubhouse by installing artificial grass after Board approval.

The Sunscape Christmas lights float, known as Santa's Toy Box, brought home a trophy for 2nd place in Casa Grande for best costumes, and a nice trophy and a \$250 prize for winning 1st place in Coolidge.

This was the first year for a special shirt, known as 'Return Request' to be available in the Activity Office for \$15. (see pic) Billie Hering started the first email distribution of Sunscape Way Happenings, Sunscape News/Info, and event

announcements in the summer. Sunscaper comment: "Wow, we're starting to get fancy now!"

A commercial recumbent bike and elliptical trainer were added to the exercise area.

In January 2014, the Computer Club published the address/phone book, a survey of the park residents concluded that 95% of lots were occupied by someone 55 or older, and sound abatement panels were installed in the Clubhouse.

Carol Thornton started a Ladies billiards group in January 2014, too. She tried playing with the men and decided it wasn't a good fit. After acceptance from the board, days were set for the ladies' league.

Fun events held during the season included trips to Hale Theatre and the Arizona Opry, the Nearly Newlywed Game, fashion shows, quilting, casino runs, craft sales, pizza parties, craft classes, ice cream socials, a tagalong to a cotton farm, and much more.

The pool was so hot that a solar value and thermostat control were added to lower the water temp during the summer. In March, the pool water discharge pipe was rerouted to the storm drainage pond west of the garbage/recycling area, and burning outside the large storage area was banned as the property is not part of the co-op.

Park road work continued in 2014, with roads being milled and new pavement laid, the installation of Registration parking on Sunscape Way, and an inverted crown on Indiana to help drainage.

The Clubhouse was closed in April for renovations and did not reopen until November 15. All summer events were held in the Activity Center. The Clubhouse electrical system was upgraded, and the kitchen was gutted and remodeled. The Activity Office was temporarily located in the Welcome Center conference room.

Also over the summer, new shuffleboard courts were built, and the brick-wall fence was painted by Kathy Miller and Helen Custer.
